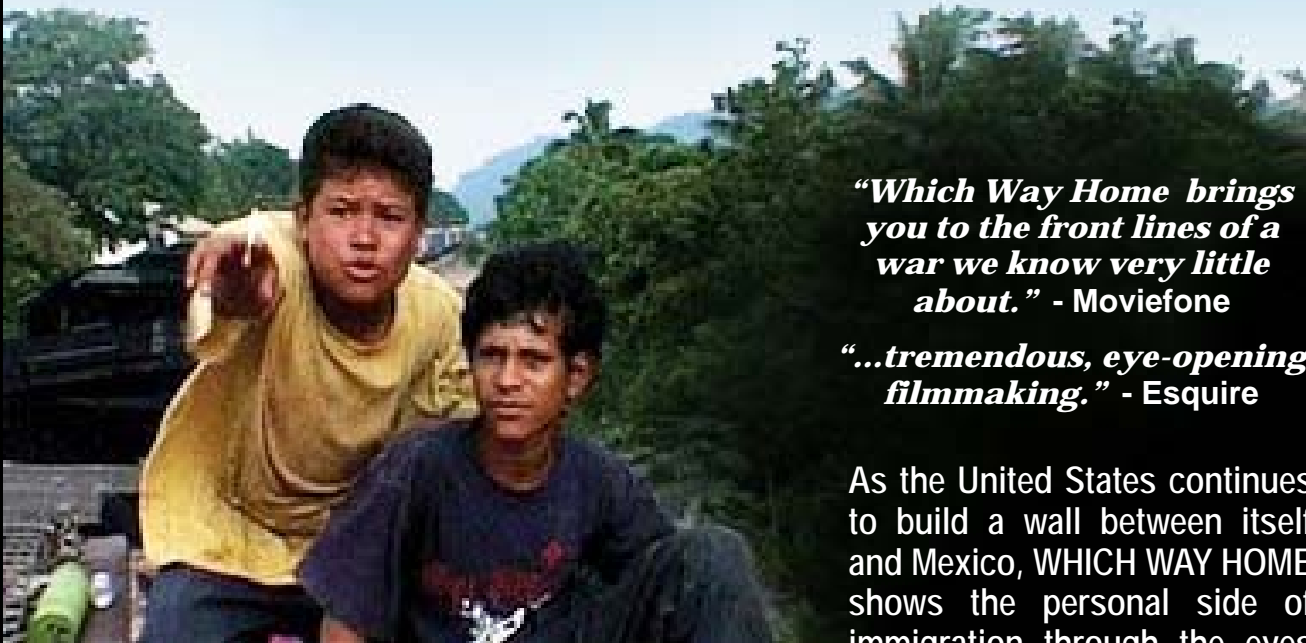

Theirs are stories of hope and courage, disappointment and sorrow.
