Film: "CAMDEN 28" (83 min, Anthony Giacchino, 2007)

Anthony Giacchino's suspenseful, tautly constructed documentary **THE CAMDEN 28** recounts one of the 20th Century's most fascinating trials. In 1971, a group of anti-war protesters decided to take action in Camden, New Jersey. Their target: the local draft board office, where they intended to destroy as much vital paperwork as possible. But during their assault, authorities barged in and stopped them in their tracks. Clearly, they had been set up. The ensuing trial sparked a passionate court room debate. Featuring a treasure of archival materials and current interviews with former FBI agents involved in the case and scholars such as Howard Zinn. **THE CAMDEN 28** is a story about a potent act of dissent that has special relevance for our current political climate.

Film: "THE SINGING REVOLUTION" (94 min, James Tusty & Maureen Castle, 2008)

With the Estonian Dance Group **"TUHANDEST TUULEST"** (which means "from a thousand winds"). And join us in a conversation with a number of first generation Estonians about the film and movement. A single nation - A million voices - The fall of an empire. In 1991, after nearly fifty years of rule by a brutal Soviet occupation, the small Republic of Estonia confronted their occupiers by announcing their independence to the world. Their charge heralded the collapse of the Soviet Union and the freedom of now-suddenly-former Soviet republics. Music played a pivotal role in these historical events. —**THE SINGING REVOLUTION** tells the story of one country's undeniable thirst for self-determination and its unshakable belief in what it means to be free—to be Estonian.
